Fall

Quarterly

- Test smoke/carbon monoxide detectors
- Test garage door auto-reverse
- Run water and flush toilets in unused spaces
- Check water softener, add salt if needed
- Give house a deep clean
- Vacuum refrigerator coils

Annually

- Flush hot water heater and remove sediment
- Apply winterizer fertilizer to your lawn
- Get heating system ready for winter
- Turn off and flush outdoor water faucets
- Clear dead plants/shrubs from the house
- Check driveway/pavement for cracks
